Hatching Faith

The Virginia Conference of the UMC Hatching Faith Cohorts Initiative seeks to more fully engage children in worship and prayer in local congregations and communities. One of our leaders in this project recent wrote this.

"I thought about the Hatching Faith Cohorts project I have been working on with the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church (<u>I've written about it here before</u>). How we are working with congregations to conduct a series of experiments in their corporate worship offerings to more meaningfully engage children in worship.

I thought about what our resident academic, Dr. Dave Csinos, said about children having a relationship with God wholly unmitigated by their parents and their pastors, how we don't have to teach faith or pass down God, because God is already at work at them. In those conversations I talked about getting out of the way for God to reach God's kids.

Now I know what we're talking about is removing the dams. Kids don't need to be introduced to God, reintroduced to God, or spoon-fed; they just need to be allowed to encounter the sacred. We simply need to remove the dams, and they will find their way straight upstream. They know in their bodies where they need to go, and it doesn't matter how many generations may not have been able to swim the river, or swim it without significant stress; if we remove the barriers, they will find their way home. This process of removing barriers so children can grow into their own relationship with Christ is what Grace Church is all about. For this to be successful, we need our congregation to embrace a few practices. First and foremost, pray for children and families. Pray that they will come to a deep, personal relationship with Jesus Christ, defined on their own terms. Second, pray that our congregation will be innovative in the way that helps children find their ministry in Christ. Third, pray that more children will come to know Christ through the intentional work of the people of Grace to be open to the work of the Holy Spirit in this congregation.


